SESSION 1: MINDING YOUR MANURE MANNERS

All manure users - not just those operating under a permit - should manage manure responsibly. This session will discuss manure contaminants and transport as well as setbacks, stockpiles, and transfers.

SESSION 2: MANURE & FERTILIZER: COMPLEMENTARY ROLES

Manure and fertilizer can work together to maximize yields and profits. This session will discuss accounting for nutrients in manure in addition to making sure you know how much manure has been applied.

We all know manure has pros and cons, but how can we maximize the good while minimizing the problems? This session will help you determine the value of manure as well as learn how to reap manure's environmental benefits.
